Yuzo Chino, Ph.D., is Benedict- McFadden Professor of Vision Sciences at the University of Houston College of Optometry. Dr. Chino joined the College of Optometry in 1988. Prior to 1988 he was a faculty member at the Illinois College of Optometry following completion of his Ph.D. from Syracuse University in 1973. His research interest is centered around the visual system development and plasticity in the visual brain and the effects of abnormal visual experience on the postnatal development of binocular functions.

Janice Wensveen, O.D., Ph.D., received her Doctor of Optometry from the University of Waterloo School of Optometry, Canada, and her Ph.D. in Physiological Optics from the University of Houston College of Optometry. Dr. Wensveen is currently Clinical Assistant Professor at the University of Houston where she teaches clinical binocular vision. Her research interests center on normal and abnormal development of binocular vision, anisometropia, strabismus and amblyopia.

Earl L. Smith III, O.D., Ph.D., received his O.D. and Ph.D. from the University of Houston in 1972 and 1978, respectively, and joined the faculty of the College of Optometry at University of Houston in 1978. Currently he holds the rank of Professor and is the Dean of the College of Optometry. In 1988, he was selected to be the Greeman-Petty Distinguished Professor in Vision Development. His primary research interests are centered on the effects of normal and abnormal visual experience on the developing visual system.

W.C. Maples, O.D., M.S., FAAO, FCOVD, received his OD degree from Southern College of Optometry (SCO) and earned a MS degree from the University of Southern Mississippi. He is

Past President of the College of Optometrists in Vision Development and is the Chair of its International Examination and Certification Board. He is a former faculty member at Northeastern State University College of Optometry (NSUCO) and is currently a Professor at SCO. He has written extensively on vision and learning problems and is the designer of the NSUCO/Maples Ocular motor test. He is currently serving as editor-in-chief of the Journal of Behavioral Optometry.

Nolan Riley, O.D., received his OD degree from Northeastern State University Oklahoma College of Optometry in 2006. Nolan received his undergraduate degree from Kansas State University where he published papers on corneal nerve innervation and trigeminal ganglion embryonic development. He is an Adjunct Assistant Professor for the University Of Houston College Of Optometry and serves as an extern site for both the University of Houston and Northeastern State University Oklahoma College of Optometry. He is in a private practice in Lubbock, Texas, that is full scope in nature with an emphasis in binocular vision problems.

Alona King, O.D., has been practicing behavioral optometry in Idaho Falls, Idaho for over 30 years. A Fellow of the College of Optometrists in Vision Development, a member of the Neuro-Optometric Rehabilitation Association, she serves as adjunct clinical faculty for Pacific University and on the Board of Directors of the Optometric Extension Program.
